



Tuesday Morning

Maureen Berger & Becky McAllister – Oldest to Youngest: How Grandparents Can Grow Your Children's Ministry So much pulls children away from God; yet, impressing Christ into their lives has never been more vital. How can churches do this? Gain practical knowledge to envision the oldest in your church growing their faith by impacting children's faith, drawing on biblical principles to help you bring the grand generation into your children's ministry.

Kurt Busenitz – Rural Church Multiplication: From Anomaly to Normality

Healthy corn plants produce more corn. Healthy cattle produce more beef. Healthy churches should be a part of multiplying gospel-centered churches in spiritually needy areas. In the spirit of Nehemiah, we will lean into pursuing healthy building blocks for effective rural church multiplication.

Kristen Humiston (women) – Renewed by Delight: Finding Restoration and Preventing Ministry Burnout
This seminar will help attendees combat the all-too-common stresses of family and ministry life. Rooted in God's
Word, participants will learn about the impact of delight on their mind, body, and soul. We will gain practical
techniques to counteract ministry pressures and maintain our spiritual and emotional well-being, while being
equipped to nurture joy, sustain calling, and prevent/heal from ministry burnout.

Jason McConnell – Preventing One-Trick Ponies in the Pulpit: Pursuing Versatility in Preaching

During their ministry training, pastors typically learn only one way to preach sermons. Unfortunately, this leads to one-dimensional and predictable sermons Sunday after Sunday. Following the various ways God speaks to His people in Scripture, this seminar will show why they should and how they can become more versatile preachers by utilizing a wide variety of sermonic models, forms, and styles.

Ted Miller – Three Financial Opportunities Every Minister Should Consider

Pastors are busy! Their role constantly moves among teacher, counselor, janitor, maintenance man, husband, dad, coach, chairman, etc. Many leaders sacrifice financially and there are several opportunities that a minister can use to eliminate financial pressure now and in their future. This session will give you the top three.

Aaron and Janice Yoder – Five Ways to Destroy Your Pastoral Family

We all want to have a healthy marriage and family while serving in ministry, but we often sabotage ourselves with these common practices. Unlearn and relearn marriage and family life together!

Barney Wells – The Big Challenge of the New Rural Poor

Over the past 40 years, rural villages have become pockets of inner-city-like poverty. Differing from the traditional rural poor in many ways, these new rural poor can present challenges to the church in the smallest of towns. We will learn what makes this ministry so challenging and some successful strategies for engaging it.

Maureen Berger & Becky McAllister – Celebrate Good Times: How to Make Any Celebration a God Encounter Childhood celebrations are often our most cherished life memories. But can these moments be even more impactful for our children? Gain ideas and practical skills on how to make celebration moments intentional God-connection moments for children.

Jeff Clark - Rural Evangelism

In this seminar we will attempt to move away from event-based evangelism that is grounded on the law of large numbers. The goal is to develop a spectrum and help develop strategies to move people along that spectrum from non-evangelist to committed evangelist.

Ted Miller - How to Stop Drowning in Debt

Debt has become the American Way. While there are several financial plans to eliminate debt, most do not complete these plans because they require a diet of rice and beans six nights per week. There is a better way to eliminate debt for you and your congregation. Join this seminar to learn the proper definition of wealth and live completely free.

Ellen Tuttle (women) - Moving Beyond Self-Reliance

Do you often find yourself striving to manage everything on your own? It's easy to think that God is too busy with bigger issues than yours and forget the purpose and reality of His daily presence. Self-reliance is exhausting! We'll talk about the peace and renewed strength that come from acknowledging how God meets us in the day-to-day of our ordinary lives, not just in times of crisis or joy. Come get recharged and embrace God's sustaining grace.

Ritch Boerckel - Personality and Preaching

This seminar explores God's purpose in creating each pastor's unique personality as His instrument for preaching His Word. We will consider the importance of pouring His truth through our own personality in our preaching and explore ways the preacher's personality can be either a destructive or constructive influence in bringing God's message to His people.

Jeff Clark - Rural Church Planting

With so many rural churches closing and the ability to easily drive to nearby towns, do we really need to plant churches in rural areas today?

Ken Helmuth - Serving the Least of These

One in 115 Americans are locked away in a prison or jail cell today, perhaps some from your rural or small-town community. These individuals are at the lowest point in their lives and desperately need the hope and forgiveness offered by our heavenly Father. This seminar will focus on equipping churches to serve these individuals.

Kristen Humiston (women) – What's a Pastor's Wife to Do About Trauma?

This seminar focuses on understanding and addressing trauma within the unique context of a pastor's wife. We will learn to recognize the signs and effects of trauma, manage our own well-being, and support our congregation and community members. We will develop practical skills to assist others in their healing journeys, empowering them as caregivers and leaders.

Ron Klassen – Maximizing the Strengths of Your Town and Country Church

Picture a town and country church that is not trying to imitate larger city churches but studies itself and its community and then prayerfully designs ministries uniquely suited for its place and time. This seminar will help this picture become a reality as we explore the distinctive characteristics – especially strengths – of the town and country church.

Lafayette Funk was a founder of the Chicago Stockyards and Director of the 1893 Chicago World's Fair. His family owned one of America's largest farms and created the first hybrid commercial seed corn. The 13-room home, built in 1864, has been extensively restored. The museum is home to over 4,000 specimens of gemstones and minerals, including an intact saber-toothed tiger skull! The cost is \$5.00 per person.
